International Keynote Speakers

Nazim Cerkes MD

Istanbul, Turkey

Dr. Nazim Cerkes started his plastic surgery training in 1985 at the Department of Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery, Istanbul University Faculty of Medicine. During his residency he has worked in the field of microsurgery and started the clinical applications of reconstructive microsurgery at the Department. In 2002 he founded Cosmed Aesthetic Plastic Surgery Center. Dr. Cerkes has been invited to several important international meetings to give lectures and perform live surgery demonstrations on rhinoplasty. Dr. Cerkes is the current President of the Turkish Society of Aesthetic Plastic Surgery. He is also Chairman of the Educational Council of ISAPS and Editorial Board Member of the Aesthetic Surgery Journal (ASJ).

Gregory R. D. Evans MD

Orange, California, USA

Gregory Evans is the Professor of Surgery and Biomedical Engineering and Chief of the Aesthetic & Plastic Surgery Institute at the University of California, Irvine. During the last ten years, Professor Evans has established a pivotal program expanding the residency to six years and creating an integrated program for medical students for certification by the American Board of Plastic Surgery. Currently Professor Evans remains active in the laboratory and has established a practice that consists of microvascular surgery, aesthetic surgery, and cancer reconstruction. He has over 323 publications which include editorials, book chapters, and peer reviewed manuscripts. He has edited 7 books and has over 710 national and international presentations.

Jeffrey A. Fialkov MD MSc FRCSC

Toronto, Canada

Jeff Fialkov is Associate Professor in the Division of Plastic Surgery at the University of Toronto and a staff plastic surgeon at Sunnybrook Health Sciences Centre, Toronto, Canada. A. Prof. Fialkov graduated from the University of Toronto Faculty of Medicine in 1989 and completed his Plastic Surgery training in the University of Toronto Surgeon Scientist Program obtaining his MSc in 1992 and Royal College Fellowship in 1997. He was appointed to the faculty at Sunnybrook Health Sciences Centre in 1998 after completing fellowships in Melbourne, Australia and Southfield, Michigan. A. Prof. Fialkov's clinical interests are in adult craniomaxillofacial and cleft-related surgery. Dr. Fialkov oversees an active graduate research program at The University of Toronto and Sunnybrook Health Sciences Centre in biomechanics of the craniofacial skeleton.

International Keynote Speakers

Joseph S. Gruss MB BChir FRCS(S)

Seattle, Washington, USA

Joseph S. Gruss had eight years of training in surgery and Plastic Surgery in London and the University of Toronto in Canada. After training, he completed one and a half years of fellowship training in craniofacial and head and neck surgery. On completion of his fellowship training in 1978, he was recruited to an academic practice at University of Toronto where the first regional trauma centre in Canada had been established. He established a protocol of management that set out to completely reconstruct the entire craniofacial skeleton in the first operation. These techniques are now standard practice around the world. In 1991 Professor Gruss was recruited as a full Professor to the University of Washington in Seattle to set up a comprehensive craniofacial surgery program, particularly at the Children's Hospital and Regional Medical Centre. In 1998, Professor Gruss became the first holder of the Marlys C. Larson Professor and Chair in Craniofacial Surgery. Additionally, he holds an adjunct appointment in Neurosurgery. He has over 100 publications to his credit and has presented over 300 local, national and international lectures including over 100 professorships.

Julian J. Pribaz MD FRACS

Boston, Massachusetts, USA

Professor Julian J. Pribaz obtained his FRACS in Plastic Surgery in 1982, and in 1986 he was accredited by the American Board of Plastic Surgery. After 5 years as a consultant at St. Vincent's Hospital, he was recruited to Harvard Medical School. He began his faculty experience at Harvard in 1987 as a Clinical Instructor in Surgery. In 1989 he was promoted to Assistant Professor of Surgery and in 1994 to Associate Professor of Surgery. In 1997 he was appointed Program Director of the then new Combined Harvard Plastic Surgery Residency Training Program, which is the largest training program in the United States, and which he ran until June 2010. In 2002 he was promoted to full Professor of Surgery at Harvard Medical School.

Professor Pribaz is the author of over 100 scientific articles in peer-reviewed journals, over 50 book chapters and 130 other reviews, discussions and publications. He has served on the editorial board of 5 major plastic surgery journals. He has been a visiting professor at over 50 national/ international institutions. He has been course director and invited lecturer at many institutions, and has given over 590 presentations nationally/ internationally. He is a member of numerous national/ international surgical and plastic surgical societies.

Professor Pribaz's research interests are primarily in the area of microvascular surgery and reconstructive surgery of the head and neck, breast, as well as, extremity reconstruction and more recently face and hand allotransplantation.

International Keynote Speakers

Bryant A. Toth MD FACS

San Francisco, California, USA

Dr. Bryant Toth was the first recipient of the Kazanjian Fellowship from Harvard University which allowed him to continue his training in pediatric craniofacial surgery under Daniel Marchac in Paris. Dr. Toth has published over 50 journal articles, 22 book chapters, seven instructional videotapes and has been the co-editor of three books. He is one of the founders and is the current Director of the Craniofacial Department at Children's Hospital Oakland. In addition, he is a Clinical Professor of Surgery at the University of California-San Francisco and an adjunct Clinical Professor at the University of the Pacific Dental School in San Francisco. His private practice encompasses aesthetic surgery and craniofacial surgery.

Michael Yaremchuk MD

Seattle, Washington, USA

Michael Yaremchuk is Professor of Surgery at Harvard Medical School. An innovator and teacher, he uses state-of-the-art techniques and knowledge to care for his patients. Professor Yaremchuk has authored three textbooks, 40 book chapters, and over 100 scientific articles. His most recent book, Atlas of Facial Implants, was awarded an Association of Medical Illustrators 2007 Award for surgical atlases. His research laboratory focuses on the potential of bioengineered tissues and transplantation to enhance or reconstruct the face and facial skeleton. Professor Yaremchuk has lectured at premier medical conferences, and at some of the best medical universities all over the world.

Registrar Prizes

All trainees were required to present a paper at the regional level prior to the Conference. This year, a number of prizes will be awarded as part of the 2013 Registrars' Conference for outstanding papers. Prize recipients will be acknowledged at the main Plastic Surgery Congress. **Prizes include:**

Emmett Prize

The Emmett Prize comprises of 2 x \$1,500 awards which may be awarded for the Best Research Presentation and the Best Clinical Presentation by a trainee at the Registrars' Conference. The Best Research Presentation requires applicants to submit a piece of original clinical research which provides analysis of formal research undertaken by the trainee related to Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery. The Best Clinical Presentation requires registrars to make a presentation related to any aspect of clinical practice including but not restricted to technique and analysis, new technique presentation review and analysis, morbidity/mortality data from clinical series, prospective clinical trials and retrospective reviews of case series.

Allergan Prize



The inaugural Allergan Prize will be awarded to one registrar for the Best Reconstruction Paper. The Allergan prize is a cash grant of \$3,000 to support the registrar's ongoing plastic surgery education.

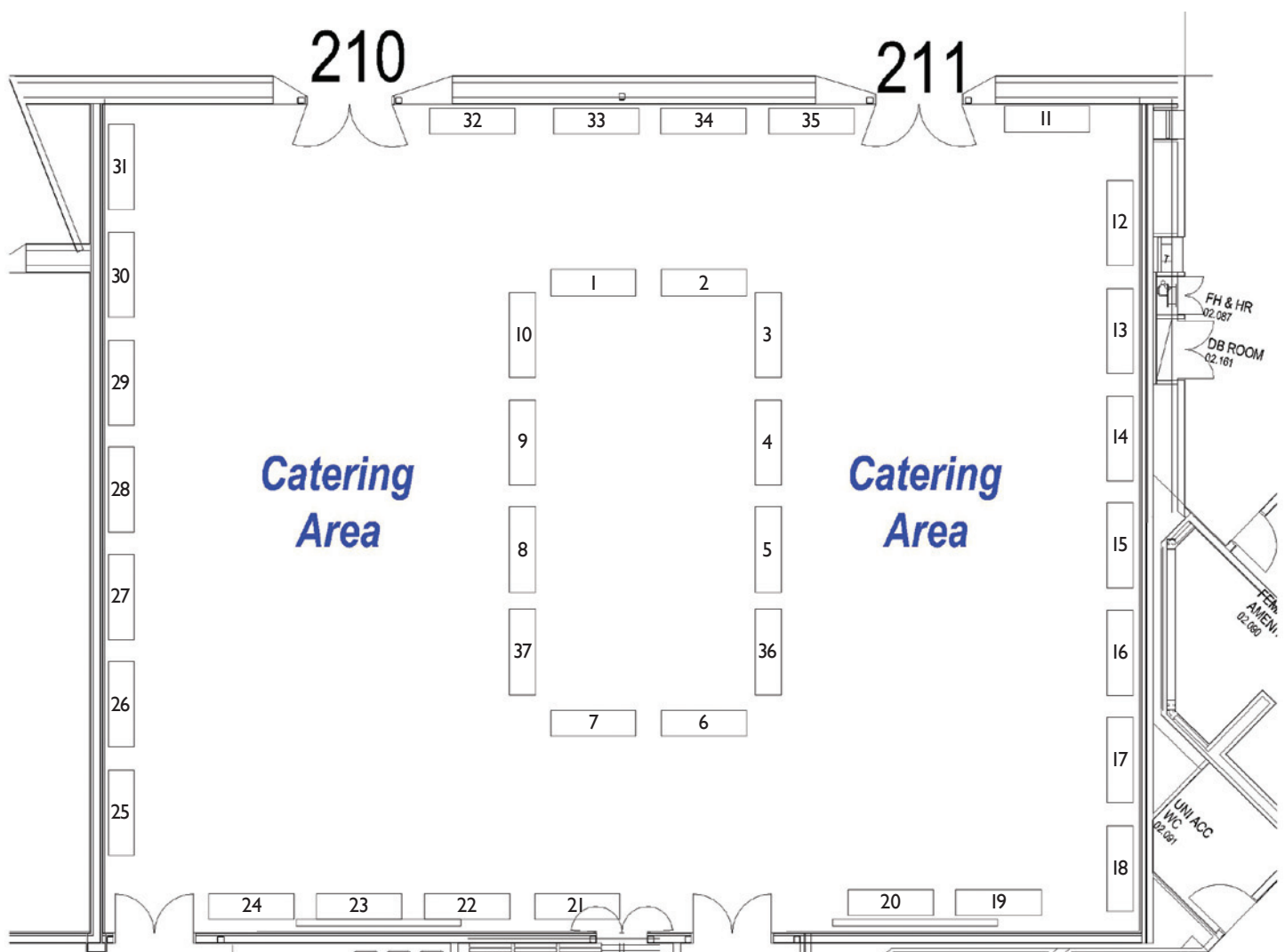
MCEC Floor Plan

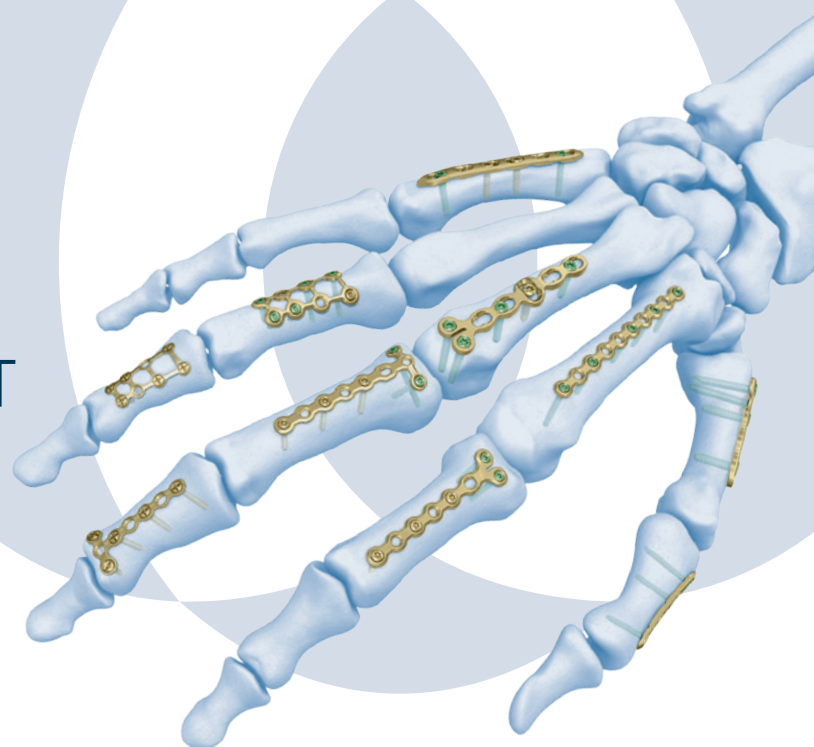

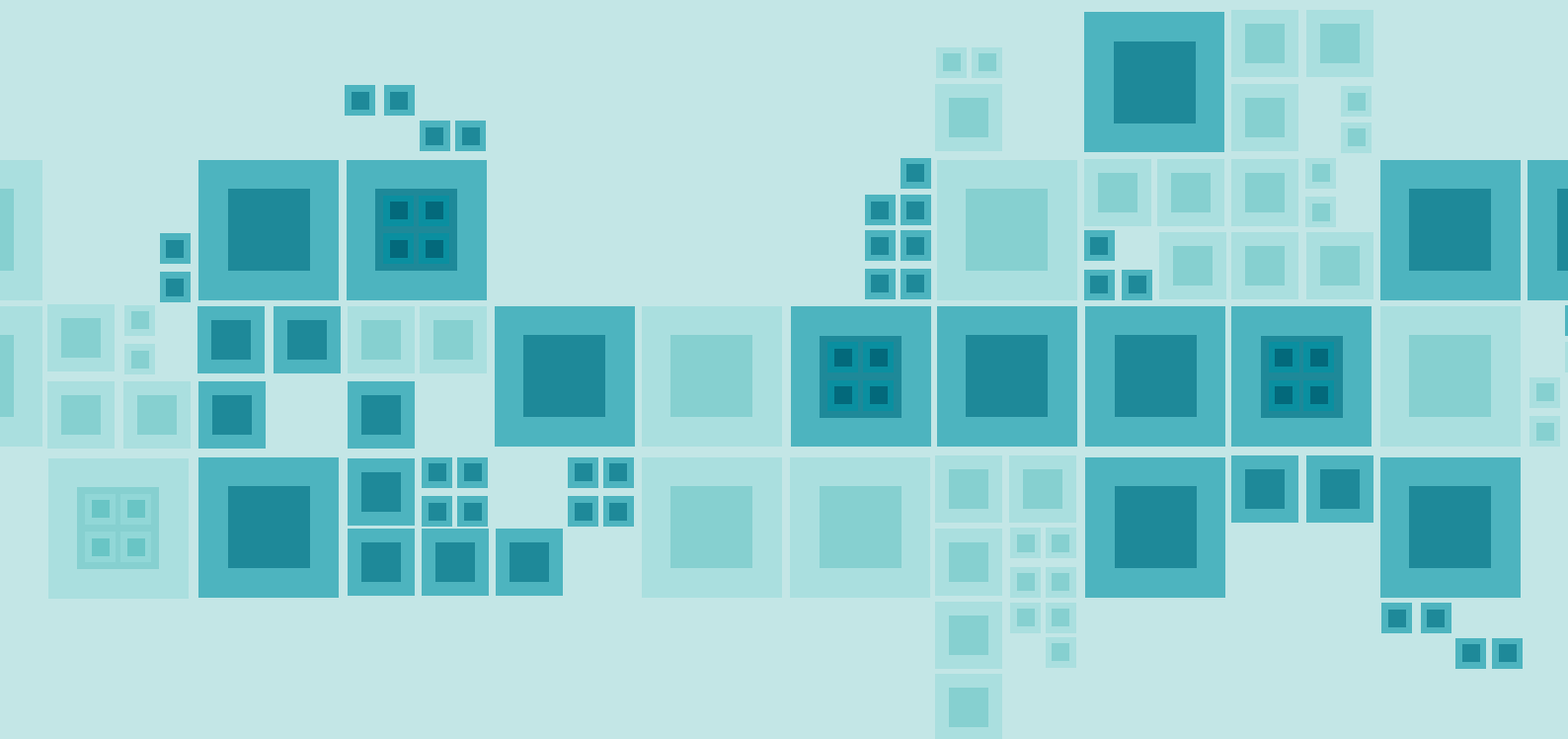
