

# **American In-Service Examination**

In 2009 the Board of PRS will introduce the American Society of Plastic Surgeons Residents In-Service/Self-Assessment Examination. This exam is not mandatory but is highly recommended for all Set 4 and Set 5 trainees and is open to all International Medical Graduates. This exam is an educational tool and does not contribute to formal assessment.

The In-Service/Self Assessment Examination provides the most up-to-date information on the core curriculum of plastic surgery. The exam offers Registrars the opportunity for self-directed learning and review of the entire scope of plastic surgery with equal emphasis placed on the following areas: Cosmetic; Comprehensive; Craniomaxillofacial; Hand. Relevant questions in basic science will be included in each of the four categories.

The exam will be held at the Wizard Computer Training Centre, 7th floor, 440 Collins Street, Melbourne Victoria on Friday 6 March 2009 at 7:30 am. # **Geelong Exam**


The Geelong exam is entering its 9th year. Over this time it has proven to be an ideal preparation for the fellowship exam in plastic surgery. The format is set up to mimic the fellowship exam with short cases, long cases, slide shows and anatomy stations. A number of plastic surgeons from around Melbourne and Geelong are invited to act as examiners including those who have previously been examiners in the fellowship exam.

The 2009 Geelong exam is condensed to a one day course and is moved to Melbourne to coincide with the Registrars' Conference. The "Geelong Exam" will take place on Saturday 7 March 2009 at the Alfred Hospital. Mr Ian Holten is the Convenor of the 2009 "Geelong Exam".

The "Geelong Exam" is optional and is available to all SET 5 candidates approaching the fellowship exam. Trainees in other years are welcome to attend as observers.

# **ASAPS Essay Exam**

The ASAPS Essay Exam will be held at the Royal Australasian College of Surgeons on Sunday 8 March 2009 at 10:00 am. This two hour exam is open to all trainees and is mandatory to be taken prior to completing your plastic and reconstruction surgical training program.

The welcome reception and the two conference dinners are included in the registration costs. Please indicate on the registration form if you wish to attend and if you have any specific dietary needs.


# **Melbourne Highlights**


Melbourne is a dynamic, exciting city with a strong sense of history and captures Australia's friendly nature with an added sense of style.




